## **WELMUN - 2024**

August 08-10, 2024

Welham Boys' School hosted the Welham Model United Nations Conference (WELMUN-2024) from August 8-10, 2024. This year's theme, 'Concordia Discordia,' meaning 'A Harmony of Discord,' captures the paradox that progress requires both collaboration and diversity. It represents the coexistence of discord and harmony, shaping the essence of existence. The conference welcomed 400 delegates from 27 prominent public schools across India and abroad. During the opening ceremony, Chief Guest Lt Gen KJ Singh (retd) addressed the student delegates, emphasizing the role of the United Nations in promoting awareness and education.

The student-led event was organized by an Executive Committee made up of seven student executive chairs. These chairs managed seven committees that simulated various UN bodies, including the United Nations Security Council, the Disarmament and International Security Committee, the United Nations Human Rights Council, the Lok Sabha, the International Criminal Police Organization, the United Nations Economic and Social Council, and the International Press Corps. The committees engaged in discussions on critical topics such as the 'Arab-Israeli War,' 'The Maritime Chokepoints,' and the 'Role of Article 356 and the Implementation of the Uniform Civil Code.'

The Closing Ceremony was honored by Pushpendra Saroj, Member of Parliament, as the Chief Guest. As the youngest person ever to serve in





Parliament, Saroj shared insights on how education has shaped his outlook and decision-making abilities. He encouraged students to appreciate diverse perspectives, actively engage with their communities, and take initiative in tackling social issues.

MUN aids in skill development and provides a platform for young individuals to engage actively in diplomatic efforts to address and resolve global conflicts.

## LEARNING HOW TO CREATE YOUR OWN STORY AT THE DOON LIBRARY AND RESEARCH CENTRE

August 20, 2024

Six enthusiastic students from our school had the opportunity to visit the Doon Library and Research Centre. Their mission? To unravel the secrets of story writing and discover the magic behind crafting compelling narratives.

Instructor: Mr. Nicolas Hoffland

**Focus:** Understanding the "Cheat Code" for effective storytelling/story writing

**The Cheat Code:** Mr. Nicolas introduced the concept of a storytelling "cheat code." According to him, every great story follows three essential steps:

**Old World:** Setting the stage by introducing characters, context, and the existing situation.

**New World:** Introducing a twist or conflict that disrupts the status quo.

**Decision:** The pivotal moment where characters make choices that drive the plot forward.

**Illustrative Example:** Mr. Nicolas used the popular Bollywood film "3 Idiots" as an example. Students analyzed how the movie followed the cheat code, from the college days (old world) to the pursuit of passion (new world) and the decision to challenge norms (decision).

**Movie Screening:** "Finding Nemo": After the theory, students enjoyed a screening of "Finding Nemo." They actively identified instances where the cheat code played out in the animated adventure.

**Discussion:** Engaging discussions followed the movie. Students explored which elements corresponded to the old world, new world, and critical decisions within the film.

**Conclusion:** The trip to the Doon Library and Research Centre left our students inspired and eager to apply the storytelling cheat code in their own writing.


The replica of the Running Trophy was presented to the team of The Doon School who were the winners in 2023.
