#### CULTURAL EVENING BY SPIC MACAY

September 25, 2024

Under the auspices of SPIC MACAY, the Vallabhatta Kalari Group hosted a captivating Kalaripayattu performance at our school. Kalaripayattu, an ancient Indian martial art that originated in Kerala, enthralled the audience with its intricate techniques and rich cultural significance. The term "Kalari" translates to "battlefield," reflecting the art's legacy of combat training, which includes weapon use, yoga, and healing practices. Often referred to as the "Mother of All Martial Arts," Kalaripayattu is revered not only for its effectiveness in combat but also for its holistic benefits for the body, mind, and spirit.

The performance showcased various components of Kalaripayattu, each highlighting a different aspect of this discipline. It began with Pootara Vandana, a salutation and invocation to honor the tradition. This was followed by Pulianga Payattu, a sequence performed after 2.5 years of training, demonstrating the skill and dedication of the practitioners.

Fundamental exercises, known as Anga Sadhakam, were also demonstrated, designed to enhance suppleness and strength. The audience was particularly enthralled by the display of weapon combat, which included staff (stick) combat, spear combat with sword and shield,

and Vadivgal—animal stances that represented creatures such as the bull, lion, horse, fish, boar, dog, and snake. The performance also included dagger combat, Valh Vali (sword massage), Vadi (stick waving), and Mel Payattu, a combination of stances and movements aimed at increasing stamina.

The program concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by our Principal, who expressed gratitude to the performers and presented tokens of appreciation to the entire group.

It was an unforgettable experience that has deepened our appreciation for our rich cultural heritage.







#### **EXPLORING NATURE**

September 29, 2024

On September 29, 2024, a nature walk led by Mr. Suniti at Anand Van (Jhajra Forest) aimed to deepen participants' understanding of local flora and fauna. The walk began with discussions on native trees, including the Kadam, Haldu, Ber, and Amla, as well as insights into Anand Bugyal, the high-altitude meadows in the Himalayas. The participants enjoyed birdwatching, identifying various species such as the Black-headed Chawara and Indian Paradise

Flycatcher, showcasing the region's avian diversity. Engaging discussions followed about local insects and plants, including the Moth Plant and the Tissue Paper Plant, which has thin, papery leaves. Observations of fungi highlighted their ecological role in decomposing wood and enriching soil, particularly during monsoons. The group also learned about the differences between venomous and poisonous creatures, emphasizing the importance of this knowledge for

safety. One highlight was the Golden Wood Spider, noted for its unique feeding habits. The walk concluded with an exploration of a large termite hill, illustrating the intricate interdependence of species within the ecosystem. Overall, the experience fostered a profound appreciation for nature, inspiring participants to continue exploring and protecting their environment.
