A VISIT TO THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, DEHRADUN

October 9, 2024

On 9.10.2024, a group of 47 students, accompanied by 5 teachers, visited the post office near Clock Tower, Dehradun on the occasion of World Post Day. Upon arrival, the post office staff gave us an informative session about their services. They explained how we can send postcards to our family and loved ones, as well as documents via simple post and speed post. We also learned that the post office handles parcels weighing up to 35 kg.

An interesting service they mentioned was the availability of Gangajal, which can be purchased at the post office and sent to anyone across the country. This allows people to send sacred water from the Ganges to their loved ones, especially those who may not have access to it.

The staff highlighted the government's savings schemes for girls and women, offering attractive interest rates, encouraging us to save money at the post office. They then showed us the Philatelic Bureau, where we saw a variety of stamps and learned that it is possible to personalize stamps with our own pictures.

Additionally, we were informed that the post office offers services related to Aadhaar, including enrollment and updates. We were also shown the mail sorting area, where we observed how letters and packages are organized for delivery.

The visit was both educational and engaging, with students learning many new things about the post office's diverse services.









VISIT TO NIVH, DEHRADUN

On the 10th of October 2024 students from classes 6, 7 and 8 visited the National Institute for Persons with Visual disabilities (NIVH), Dehradun. They headed straight to the office of the Director, NIVH Dehradun. While the students were in the audio recording studio of NIVH, the Director NIVH addressed the students and answered the questions raised by the students.

Students were elated to visit the FM studio and they readily interacted

with the radio jockey present.

The students also visited the library and gained insight into the Braille writing system.

Students were excited when they entered the computer lab for the visually challenged and they gained more knowledge on the way the visually challenged use the digital platforms. Students also visited the science lab and they understood the modification made to suit the needs of the visually challenged.

Students were shown the complete process of the printing of the Braille manuscripts.

The visit to NIVH, Dehradun was very informative for the students. The students appreciated the endeavors made by NIVH to improve the quality of life for the visually impaired.
